



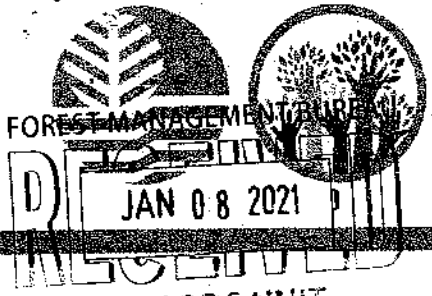

Anent our Memorandum dated 18 November 2020 regarding FMB's participation to the week-long celebration of the National Climate Change Consciousness Week from November 19-25, 2020, please find hereunder the highlights of activities conducted.

1. Video Documentary entitled "KLIMA"

The Bureau launched the first episode of the video documentary entitled "KLIMA" last November 23, 2020, via the official YouTube channel and Facebook page of FMB. The 7-minute video features what climate change is and what human activities greatly contribute to it.

2. Roundtable Discussion on Climate Emergency Response: Opportunities on Climate Change Mitigation

The Forest Management Bureau, together with the Center for Conservation Innovations Philippines, Inc., organized the Roundtable Discussion on Climate Change Emergency Response: Opportunities on Climate Change Mitigation last November 24, 2020 via Zoom application. The main goal of this undertaking is to catalyze climate action in the Philippines, in particular, by ensuring a common, deeper and updated understanding of Reducing Emissions from Deforestation and Forest Degradation (REDD+). Also, this activity brought together the high-level government officials and stakeholders from the private sector to dialogue on the challenge of climate emergency and to talk about the current climate mitigation initiatives, policy responses, and opportunities for collaboration.

The roundtable discussion was attended by a total of sixty-seven (67) participants, consisting of representatives from different DENR offices, private sectors, civil society organizations, non-government organizations, and other national government agencies. It includes presentations on the National Climate Change Action Plan (NCCAP)


Accomplishments, civil sector organizations and private sector initiatives on REDD+ and climate change such as the Ayala Corporation's Kasibulan Project and Shell's Nature-Based Solutions Program.

3. Climate Action Bingo

Climate Action Bingo was FMB's first ever interactive online game on Facebook. In this game, participants showcased their accomplishments and efforts to lessen their carbon footprint during the pandemic by crossing out on the Bingo cards provided to them.

Based on the comment section, there were eighty-eight (88) individuals who joined and submitted their entries in the said interactive online game. Five (5) lucky winners were randomly selected from the pool of participants and were given bamboo adventure set (lunch box, tumbler and utensils) from The Bamboo Company. This game also encouraged the public to do their part in avoiding activities that can contribute to the changing climate patterns.
